OBSERVATION



The **Alpes Maritimes** department, such as many other territories, suffers from important genetical erosion, land abandonment, loss of agronomical expertise and land pressure. At the same time, the department is particularly affected by climate change consequences in France (days of sunshine, dryness, etc.). To deal with these increasing issues in ecological transition context, only farmer seeds can work. They are climate change resilient and locally adapted, so no additional water or fertilisers are needed.

WHERE? Alpes Martimes French department

CROP DIVERSITY PRESERVATION

WHAT?

• Network a group of farmers, gardeners, chefs, consumers and research workers;

• **Prospect and collect** the seeds and related local expertise;

• Participative selection and multiplication of farmer seeds;

• **Diffuse selected seeds** among other farmers from the region;

• Make the greatest number of people aware of the importance of local seeds heritage.

FOR WHAT?

• Ensure a sustainable scattering of the seeds and of the know-how that are associated to their reproduction and saving, to ensure local farmers' autonomy and to guarantee a healthy, fair and accessible food.

• Mobilise citizens – consumers – on these issues to allow a systemic change of our agricultural and food system.

LOCAL FOOD VALORISATION

WHAT?

• **Involve** chefs and consumers in the valorisation process of farmer seeds

• **Raise awareness** among citizen during public tasting events with the help of the chefs engaged in the project and their restaurants;

• **Reinforce** the bond between consumers, chefs and farmers.



FOR WHAT?

• Make professionals and consumers aware of the nutritional and gustative properties of local seeds, which are adapted to local needs and culinary traditions..

AGROECOLOGICAL TRANSITION PROMOTION

WHAT?

• **Initiate actions** to raise awareness among farmers, distributors, elected representatives and general public;

• Identify and remove the brakes encountered by gardeners when using farmer seeds;

- Examine consumers' perception of farmer seeds when they are to buy and consume;
- Progressively guide farmers and consumer towards an agroecological transition based on farmer seeds reappropriation.

FOR WHAT ?

• **Remove** the technical, economical, organisational, logistical, cognitive, social and environmental brakes to use farmer seeds;

• Reintroduce in farming practices seeds varieties that are adapted to local distribution channels and organic agriculture;

• Encourage the consumption of farmer seeds-produced food in order to promote a global agroecological transition.
